### BARTLEY TOWNS

PAGE 98 STATE OF GEORGIA, GREENE COUNTY.

6 September 1809, will of Bartley Towns, deceased. To beloved wife Polly Towns, a negro woman named Fanny, livestock, farm tools and equipment, household and kitchen furniture, and a plantation of 140 acres in Randolph County, Georgia

To son Terry Towns, negro girls Temp and Cellia to him and his heirs forever. To daughter Lucy Towns, negro girls Chaney and Hannah, to her and her lawful heirs forever. To son Bartlet, a negro man named Ambros; to son Henry, a negro man named Asa; to sons Bartlet and Henry, a negro woman named Milly.

All property to be kept together for the maintenance and education of my children until they become of age. Appoint wife Polly Towns, Friends Marlin Towns and David Hardwick Executors of my estate. Wit.: Richard Smith, David Crawford and Thomas Crawford Jr., Recorded 2 January 1810. Henry Carleton Jr. C.C.O
