"Naturalization Records 1839 – 1954 Dubois County, Indiana"

Records are abstracted from Civil Order Books, Common Pleas Books, Declarations Intentions Records, Final Oath Book, Final Oath Record, Miscellaneous Indictments, and Probate Order Books. Each record will contain some of the following information; name, age, occupation, native of country, departure port, date of departure, arrival port, date of arrival, country or state they renounce allegiance to, date of declaration, court of declaration, witnesses names, a miscellaneous notes column, a book and page number for that record. Extracted records are from books "Records of Apprentice's Indentures No. 1", Indentures of Apprenticeship Record No. 1", and "Recorder's Miscellaneous Books 1, 2 and 10" of Dubois County, Indiana. Apprenticeships are a find for genealogists. If you have a missing family member, perhaps you can find them in these records. "1860 Census Dubois County, Indiana"

Population census columns included are: Dwelling number, Name of every person, Age, Sex, Color, Profession or Trade, Place of birth. Summaries are given for the number of White Males, White Females, Colored Males, Colored Females, Foreign Born, Deaf & Dumb, Blind, Insane, Idiotic, paupers, Married within year, Attended school within the year, Cannot read or write, Convicts and total inhabitants by township. *Mortality census* columns included are: Name of person who died, Age, Sex, Color, Free or Slave, Married or Widowed, Place of Birth, Month in which person died, Profession, Occupation or Trade, Disease or cause of death, Number of days ill. A Summary is given for the Total Number of Deaths, Number of White Males, Number of White Females, Number of Black Males, Number of Black Females, Number of Mulatto Males, Number of Mulatto Females, Number of Male Slaves, Number of Female Slaves, Number Married, Number Widowed. "1880 Census Dubois County, Indiana"

Population census columns included are: Page number, Dwelling number, Family number, Name of every person, Sex, Age, • Month of birth, if born during year, Single, Married, Widowed or Divorced, Occupation, Place of birth, Father's Place of birth, Mother's Place of birth. Summary is given for the Total Number of inhabitants in each township. *Mortality census* columns included are: Family number, Name of person who died, Age, Sex, Single, Married or Widowed, Place of Birth, Father's place of Birth, Mother's place of Birth, Month in which person died, Disease or cause of death. A Summary is given for the Total Number of Deaths in each township. Map of the Dubois County, Indiana townships and towns listed in the census. "Dubois County, Indiana 1928 Plat Book"

This publication is a reprint of the original maps plus a added Name Index of the landowners and a added County Map showing the township divisions. These maps show the major highways of the time, school locations, some church and cemetery locations. Not all landowners are listed on the plat maps. Landowner's names were unlisted for less than 20 acres, or initials only were used where space was limited. Our research of the 1925-1929 Assessor's Township Plat books and Township Transfer Books 1925-1930 located in the Courthouse Records Library of Dubois County, Indiana were used for completion of names.
