FIRST UNITED PENTECOSTAL CHURCH

When the Union Church was demolished in the storm of 1917, the Pentecostal Holiness congregation built a tabernacle-style building on site where the present church sits. In 1924, at a cost of \$5,000, the new brick building was completed.

During the depression, the congregation disbanded for two years, and the Church of God held services in the building. The original Pentecostal group recovered their "Little Brick Church" in 1938, and have maintained regular services from that time.

Rev. Virgil Foster is the present pastor, and the deacons are George Jamerson, James Winkle, and Gerald Crucani.
