To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Surveyor General's Certificate No. 1221
of new location under act of 4th of July, 1836

Whereas, There has been deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, a certificate, numbered 1221, of the SURVEYOR GENERAL of Missouri, whereby it appears that the claim of Curtis Hillman, or his legal representatives, is entered as No. 257, in the first class of the Decisions of the Board of Land Commissioners in Missouri, under the acts of Congress of the 4th of July, 1836, and 2d of March, 1845; and that after a survey No. 1221 had been executed for the said claim, it is found that there have been located three hundred forty one hundredths of an acre of the said land, and that in virtue of the act of Congress approved 4th of July, 1836, entitled "An act conferring claims to land in the State of Missouri, and for other purposes," the conference was invited, in lieu of the land thus previously disposed of, to a new location on other lands in Missouri subject to entry at private sale; and whereas in virtue of the rights of new location aforesaid, it appears from a certificate, No. 781661, of the REGISTER OF THE LAND OFFICE at Mexico, as contained on the aforesaid certificate of the SURVEYOR GENERAL, that the following described tracts of land have been located in full satisfaction thereof, in the district of lands subject to sale at Mexico, Missouri, to-wit: the South West quarter of the South West quarter of fractional Section Thirty-one, in the East half of the North East quarter, and the North West quarter of the North East quarter, of Section Thirty-three, in Township Twenty-nine North, of Range Sixteen East, and the North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section Thirty-two, in the North West fractional quarter of the North West fractional quarter of the North West fractional quarter, of Section Thirty-three, in Township Twenty-nine North, of Range Sixteen East, containing three thousand and forty three acres and thirty four hundredths of an acre, - the tract of twenty acres and thirty four hundredths of an acre having been paid for, as per Receiver's receipt No. 118887.

Now know Ye, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the petition and payment to the aforesaid act of Congress of 4th of July, 1836, have GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT unto the said Curtis Hillman, or his legal representatives, and to his or their heirs, the tract of land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities and appurtenances of whatsoever nature thereunto belonging unto the said Curtis Hillman, or his legal representatives, and to his or their heirs and assigns forever.
