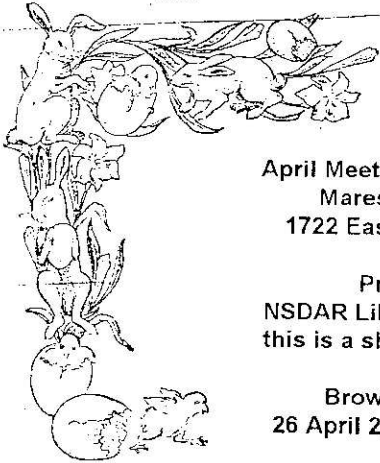

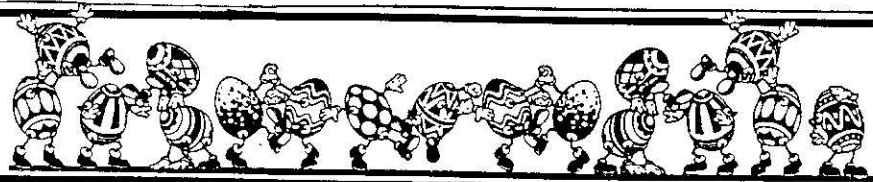

Glencoe, May 2 - April went out with a snow storm with the temperature as low as 28. As 28 and below is the danger line for most fruit in full bloom, the prospects are still fair for a fruit crop, as the bloom is yet tardy on most trees.

Claire has finally finished a project she started a number of years ago, and was interrupted. This winter and the strong storms kept her in, and she finished reading the old newspapers of the Fremont Tri-Weekly Tribune. Adding about 2,000 cards of births, marriages and deaths to the large number we already have. Some very good information poured forth from those pages and they will be used for the Roots & Leaves in the future.

To Our Members - remember that we have the monthly newsletters from Nebraska Genealogical Societies and have many hints and self helps to pass on to you. There are also out-of-state quarterlies that are available. It appears that they are not used or even asked about. Ask Claire, she will be happy to help you get acquainted with the newsletters and quarterlies. Our library is just waiting to be used. There are many books that have been purchased, but few have been used. There are books for the Germans, Czech, Irish Famine Immigrants, Compendiums of old times. The computer has replaced books. The following was found in an old Dodge Criterion of 1895

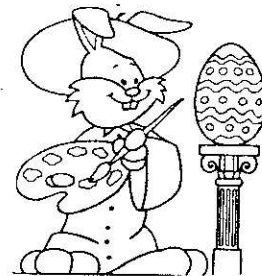
A Fullerton girl found a package of love letters that had been written to her mother by her father before they were married.
