Five generation family charts have already been indexed for members up to No C-21. We will be making new forms for our files.

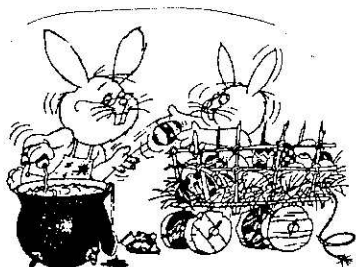

- 1 Aug 1855 – 18 Apr 1890 Castle Garden
- 19 Apr 1890 – 31 Dec 1891 Barge Office
- 1 Jan 1892 – 13 June 1897 Ellis Island
- 14 June 1897 – 16 Dec 1900 Barge Office
- 17 Dec 1900 – 31 Dec 1924 Ellis Island

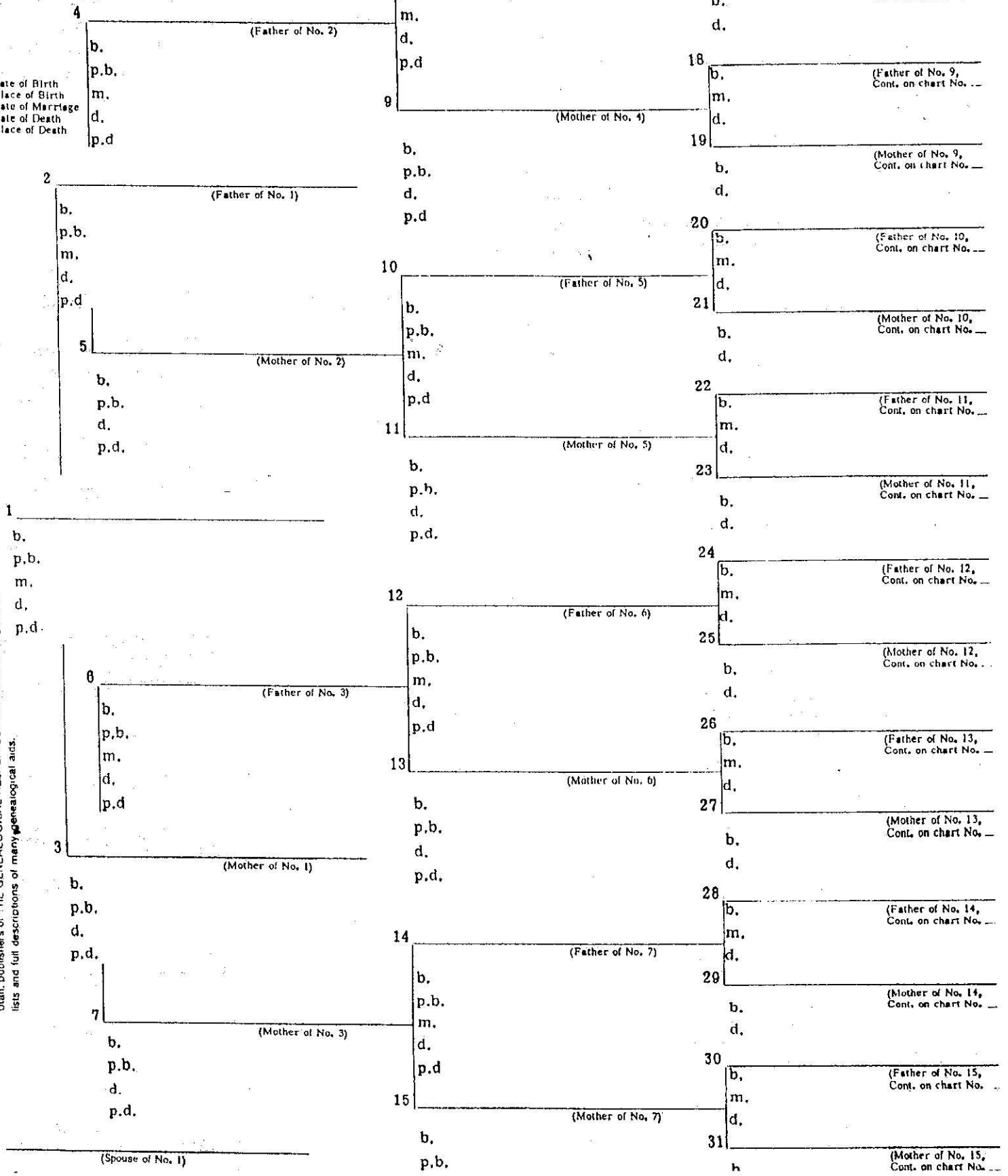
