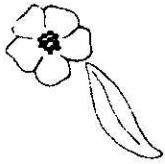

An interesting article appeared in the Dodge Criterion 15 Jan 1899, as follows:

The postoffice at the St Charles, in Cuming county, will be discontinued after January 31, an order to that effect having been issued by the postoffice authorities at Washington. The St Charles mail will be sent to Monterey after that date. An order was also issued discontinuing the postoffice at Blakely, Madison county, mail to go to Emerick.

Persons seeking families with those addresses will perhaps not find a St Charles on the map, and these small items can be of help in your family search.'

Miss Sonin was attractively gowned in a sheer, white embroidered lingerie gown, made slightly Empire. Her shower bouquet was of bride's roses. A bank of sweet peas and white roses formed a pretty setting for the wedding ceremony, which was performed by Rabbi Cohn of Omaha. The two young people were attended by their fathers only. A company of relatives and a few near friends were present.

When the ceremony was completed, Mr & Mrs Waldman sat down with the guests to a delectable wedding dinner, the entire company of twenty-six gathering about one long table. Carnations formed the centerpiece, while long streamers of smilax and a cluster of sweet pears added to the attractiveness of the decorative design.

Mr Waldman and his bride left on the afternoon of their wedding day for a five weeks' honeymoon to Chicago, Washington and New York City.
