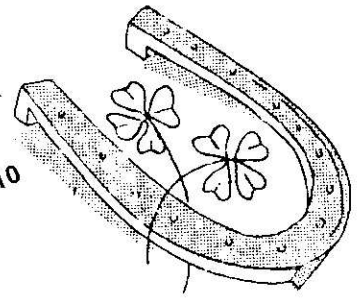

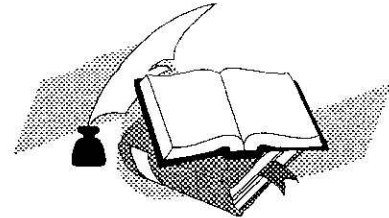

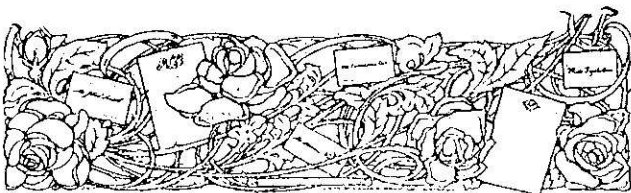
This is our last meeting until we meet again in September on the 13th.

YOUNG FIRE CHIEF GIVEN DONKEY RIDE ABOUT CITY
Firemen Give Their Leader to Elaborate Charivari

Straddling a diminutive donkey and escorted by half a hundred stalwart fire-fighters, Fire Chief Harry Hauser passed a strenuous half hour last evening, riding thru the streets in the business section of the city. The procession marched, not to the tune of the fire whistle, but of a brass band, and scores of people were attracted to the course of the parade by the music.

The fire chief was taken unawares at the firemen's parlors and was hoisted on to the back of a rather unwilling donkey. The procession then formed with Stockfeld's Boys' band in full dress uniforms following the counted chief. Representatives of four hose companies dragging two hose carts brought up the rear.

Thru Main street, down Fifth and thence southward to his home the fire chief was taken. There he was forced to bring Mrs Hauser out and introduce her to his band of fire fighters. A box or two of cigars did the rest.

Ruthlessly they dragged the youthful benedict from his bride's side and mounted him once more upon the much-suffering donkey. Back thru Main street the charivari party made its way, winding up at the firemen's parlors. It was the most successful charivari sprung on an unsuspecting victim here for a long time.

After a short wedding trip to Omaha the young couple went to housekeeping in a home which the groom had provided on east Tenth street.
