IT WAS A JOKE

Sunday Theatre-Goers Surprised They Had to Pay
That it Was a Free "Spirit" Performance and
Big Crowd Turned Out for Spooky Session.

It was a good joke on a number of church people of Fremont who patronized a legerdemain performance at a theater Sunday evening, believing it to be a spiritualists' meeting.

It was a good joke, too, that an admission of twenty-five and thirty-five cents was charged at the door when everybody expected they would be let off with a collection, and this joke is no more deeply appreciated than the former.

Aside from all the deceptions, on which the whole performance seemed to be based,, it was a rattling good Sunday night show. The two legerdemainists who gave it and cleared up some eighty-five dollars by the enterprise had a big part of the good church and other people guessing till the end. A committee of honorable Fremont citizens picked at random from the crowd had a conspicuous place on the stage and very kindly assisted in several of the acts without discovering, just how all of the things were done.

But the committee was convinced of one thing, and that is that there was nothing very spiritualistic about the meeting. There were several good Fremont church members who were "right down and mad" when they found out they had been buncoed into attending Sunday night theatricals under the name of Spiritualism and mediums and such. Fearing, perhaps, that the city authorities might attempt to interfere, the legerdemainists did not state in their advertising matter that a charge would be made at the door.

RETURN SERVICE REQUESTED

Ordinance relative to obstructions on streets or sidewalks by trees, limbs, awnings, boxes, snow or other obstructions:

Sec 1. Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of North Bend, Dodge county, Nebraska, that it is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to place or leave or permit to be placed or left with their consent within the limits of any street, alley or on any sidewalks, any cat, barrow, lumber or any other article or thing whatsoever in such a manner as to obstruct or interfere with public use or travel of or on any such street, alley or sidewalk or any part thereof.

Sec 2. No person shall erect any sign-post, sign or other device across the sidewalk or any street or allow trees or limbs to grow to the annoyance of inconvenience of the public, nor shall any person erect or maintain any awning, sign or obstruction whatever over any sidewalk, unless every part thereof is at least seven(7) feet above such sidewalk.

Sec 3. No person shall excavate the soil contiguous to the line of any street and leave the same open and exposed so as to endanger passers by in the city.

Sec 4. It shall be unlawful for any owner or occupant of any lot to allow snow or mud to accumulate on the sidewalks along side their lots or to allow snow or mud to remain on said sidewalks, but such sidewalks shall be cleaned within six (6) hours after the cessation of any storm, unless the storm or fall of snow shall have occurred in the night time in which case the sidewalks shall be cleaned before noon of the following day.

Sec 5. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be on conviction be fined not less than two (2) dollars nor exceeding six (6) dollars with cost of prosecution.

Sec 6. It is hereby declared to be the duty of the City Marshal, Chief of Police or Policeman, whenever any violation of this ordinance shall come to his knowledge, to notify the person or persons violation any of the provisions hereof within three(3) hours after such notice is given.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Passed and signed this 23rd day of February one thousand, eight hundred and ninety-one.
