Shortly after she left port, some parties holding a mortgage started overland to overhaul the steamer at this place, but she stopped at Staat's landing and was there sold to J H Staats - On Sunday some parties were employed who run her back to the Bend, but on Tuesday Staats regained possession by compromising with the mortgagees, and tomorrow she will be at the old Ransford crossing, three miles west of town, ready to cross teams. Fremont again rejoices in two ferries and under the able and
