### BIG SNOW STORM ACCOMPANIES NEW YEAR

Worst Storm for years, Was Experienced  
In this Part of Nebraska from Saturday until Monday

The fierce storm accompanied by a heavy snow, which started at about the break of the new year, on Saturday night as one of the worst for many years.

The snow fall, on the level would have been about four inches, but it was drifted together in drifts as high as four

and five feet on the streets of Scribner, especially in the business blocks.

This storm caused great delay on all railroads. To this date they have not been able to run on time. No 2, the early passenger this morning was over an hour late. On Monday no effort was made to run any freights at all. A number of snow plows were sent up on the main line and also the branch to clear the right of way.

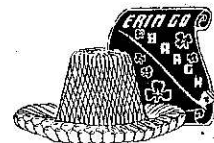
