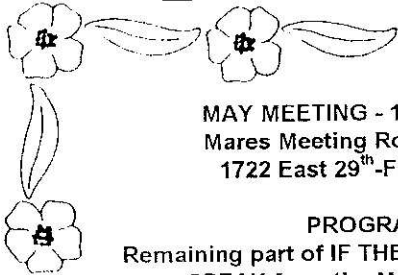

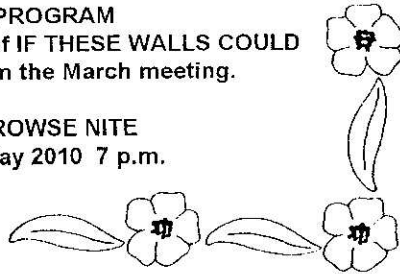

Memorial Day at Glencoe(cemetery)  
from Criterion Supplement May 31, 1901

To draw a word picture of the affair would simply contain  
the expression "Success".

The day was perfect and the gathering immense. Promptly  
at 10 a.m., the patriotic people gathered enmass as if by  
signal shot from a mortar or a blazing torch from a tower.

The present, D C Westfall, stepped upon the base of the  
National obelisk and called to order the surging throng, when  
old "Coronation" was sung by the multitude, typical of true  
American zeal.

After prayer by Rev. Underwood, twelve proud young  
American heroines, uniformed and badged with national  
colors, marched in military manner to the six graves of the  
Union Defenders and placed thereon boquets of God's smiles  
in quantities sufficient to be called "lavish." Besides this it  
would seem, to walk through the city of the Dead, no grave

was neglected. Parents, wives, sisters and brothers had all  
called upon their departed loved ones to embellish their  
tombs with fragrance and beauty.

Dinner - Groups of grateful people monopolized the shade  
of God's Temple for refreshments, where were edibles of  
more substance and quantity than a Trio of Del Monicas  
would dare to set at a fabulous price.

At 1:30 the church edifice was packed to the portals with  
enthusiasts. At the first sound of the chiming voices of the  
Glencoe Glee Club, who under the tutorship of Prof Dey  
Myers, enlivened the occasion equal to any talented musical  
specialist in the galleries of Glasco.

Rev W H Underwood of North Bend, was then introduced,  
who weighed his words in the scale of justice and gave an  
oration with pith and point, gratefully accepted by his  
attentive bearers and beautifully rolled away the mists of  
enmity between the boys of the Blue and the Gray.

Following were declamations recitations and singing until  
Rev Howard of Dodge took the floor for the closing address.  
He handled the principles of true patriotism barehanded for  
twenty minutes, equal to Webster, Douglas or Henry Clay.

Everybody termed the entertainment "a patriotic love feast"  
and a strengthening of the bonds of fellowship.

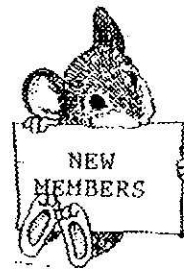
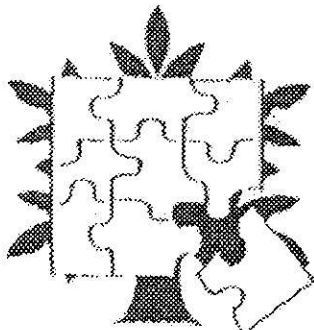
