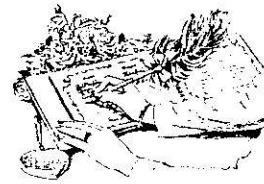
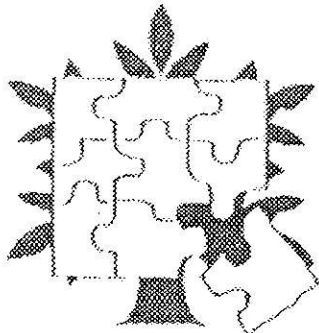
MISS M'VICKER MARRIED

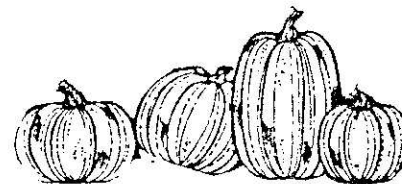
The church was prettily decorated for the occasion with potted plants and cut flowers.
