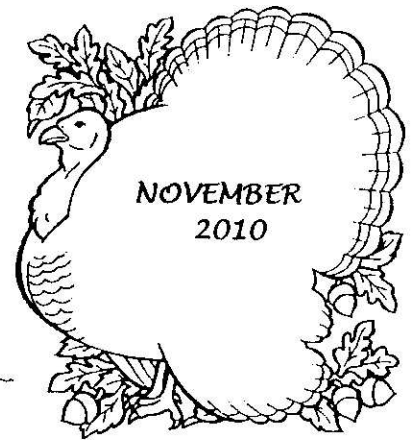

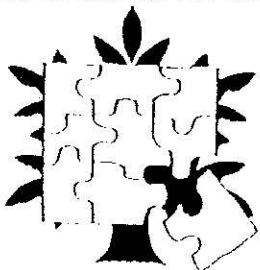
RUFF-NOLAN

NEW STATE BANK AT NICKERSON

Several Fremont Men Interested in Financial Corporation
Just Formed.

H J Sidner, a brother of S S Sidner of this city, is the promoter and organizer of a new state bank at Nickerson, which he has incorporated under the name of the First Bank of Nickerson. Some time ago he called on the officers of the Fremont National of city, with reference to the matter, and the result was in immediate incorporation with an authorized capital of \$25,000. Of this amount \$7,500 will be issued to start with. This has all been subscriber and the money paid in, and the bank will open for business at once.

The officers are as follows: President, W J Courtright; Vice President L M Keene; Cashier, H J Sidner. The directors are H J Sidner, W J Courtright, L M Keene, Julius Beckman and John Sidner. The last named director is one of the solid farmers of that vicinity and the father of the cashier. Arrangements have been made for the highest quality of protection, both from fire and burglars.

The building formerly occupied by Tucker Bros drug store in Nickerson has been purchased and will be used by the bank. The deal for the property was completed Tuesday by the filing of a deed in the register's office.
