The bride wore a handsome traveling suit of dark blue with hat to match. The bridesmaid wore a pretty wisteria colored suit and the gentleman wore the usual black.

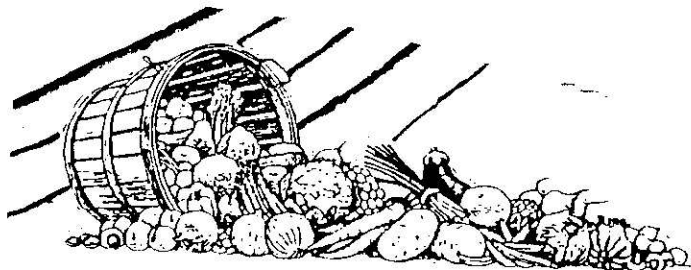
The bride was born and raised in our little city. She is a graduate of our high school and has a large circle of friends and well wishers.
